Lisa M. Grubb 博士 (Dr. Lisa M. Grubb)

現任約翰霍普金斯大學護理學院 (Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing) 實務教育軌 (Practice Education Track) 助理教授，並為該校全職教職員。同時擔任美國馬里蘭州巴爾的摩 Mercy Hospital 的傷口造口護理師 (Wound Ostomy Nurse)，亦於 Daniel Torsch Foundation 為無家者族群提供傷口、造口與失禁護理 (WOCN) 服務。

Dr. Grubb 取得約翰霍普金斯大學護理學院護理實務博士 (Doctor of Nursing Practice, DNP) 學位，並具備家庭專科護理師 (Family Nurse Practitioner, FNP) 專業認證。

Dr. Grubb 擁有超過三十年的臨床護理經驗，專業歷程涵蓋加護病房 (Critical Care)、手術室 (Operating Room) 及麻醉後恢復室 (Post-Anesthesia Care Unit)。她曾於美國具開創性的次急性照護 (Subacute Care) 機構擔任長期照護體系之董事及副總裁，負責管理橫跨全美 25 州、共 87 家醫療照護機構。其後，她於馬里蘭州巴爾的摩兩所大型學術醫學中心擔任感染預防與控制主任 (Director of Infection Prevention and Control)，並進一步擔任醫療品質與病人安全資深總監 (Senior Director for Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety)，全面負責醫療品質、病人安全、感染管制及中風照護計畫。

Dr. Grubb 的研究重點聚焦於壓力性損傷 (Pressure Injury) 預防與醫療品質改善。目前進行中的研究計畫，著重於透過預防性敷料的精準使用及風險評估策略，以降低腫瘤科病人發生壓力性損傷的比例。她亦同步進行急診與術後手術部位感染風險儀表板 (Risk Dashboard) 之研究，期能提升高風險族群感染的早期辨識能力與臨床照護成效。

除臨床與學術工作外，Dr. Grubb 亦長期致力於培育新世代進階護理師 (Advanced Practice Nurses)，並已通過研究計畫審核，探討強化專科護理師 (Nurse Practitioners) 傷口照護教育之策略與成效。

Dr. Lisa M. Grubb is an Assistant Professor and full-time faculty member in the Practice Education Track at the Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing and serves as a Wound Ostomy Nurse at Mercy Hospital in Baltimore Md. She also serves as a WOCN for the homeless at the Daniel Torsch foundation. She holds a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from the Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing and a Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) certification.

With more than three decades of nursing experience, Dr. Grubb's career spans critical care, the operating room, and post-anesthesia recovery. She has served as a Director and Vice President in long-term care for one of the nation's pioneering subacute care companies, overseeing 87 facilities across 25 states. She subsequently held leadership positions as Director of Infection Prevention and Control for two large academic medical centers in Baltimore, Maryland, and later as Senior Director for Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety—responsible for Quality, Patient Safety, Infection Control, and Stroke Care programs.

Dr. Grubb's research interests include pressure injury prevention and healthcare quality improvement. Her ongoing projects focus on reducing pressure injury incidence in oncology patients through targeted use of prophylactic dressings and risk assessment strategies. She is also conducting research on the development of a risk dashboard for emergency room and post-operative surgical site infections, aimed at improving early identification and outcomes in vulnerable populations.

In addition to her clinical and academic roles, Dr. Grubb is passionate about mentoring the next generation of advanced practice nurses and has an approved study exploring strategies to enhance wound education for nurse practitioners.

Outside of work, she enjoys gardening, landscaping, cooking, traveling, and reading historical fiction.
